MOTOR SKILLS CIRCUIT FOR OUR LAKESIDERS

When we talk about motor skills, we refer to the control that humans can exert over their own bodies. Typically, we associate the term "motor skills" with play, as it involves a dynamic where stimuli and previously acquired experiences are mixed, resulting in increasingly coordinated and elaborated movements.

At Lakeside, we have created a psychomotor circuit where children can go through as many times as they want. In this circuit, they can use handrails or monkey bars, walk, climb and descend different obstacles, and move around in whichever way they like or find most suitable.

The circuit helps in the acquisition of skills for writing and reading, where our Lakesiders engage in many fine motor exercises that promote manual activity, while not neglecting gross motor skills, which are crucial for improving their motor behavior. All of this, combined with our comprehensive program that fosters a love for reading and reading comprehension, which is the basic skill for learning



As a complement to this, in Kinder 3, we have a classroom library where books are shared weekly to motivate and improve the reading and writing process. The importance of the project also lies in making metacognition a part of it, bringing the book to the reality of our students.
