

SYMBOLIC GAME IN PRESCHOOL

Symbolic game allows Lakesiders to live in other worlds, to set their creativity and imagination in motion, to overcome fears and gain confidence, as well as externalize behaviors learned through observation.

In our symbolic game classroom our Lakesiders spend moments of great fun and learning. The children use their mental representation skills to recreate an entire play scenario; that is, they are able to combine real and imaginary events recreating fictitious situations as if they were really happening, characters and objects come to life in their imagination.



ATELIER, A SPACE FOR CREATION

The atelier is a space that provokes experiences in our students, where we value the importance of the development of creative thinking and the physical space as a third teacher".

The atelier is a space that stands out by having a large amount of materials, tools and resources.

The key to its incorporation lies, on the one hand, in seeking to get students to work actively in a context that values their experiences and creativity.


On the other hand, it is about getting students to take responsibility for their own learning, by providing them with the necessary time and space.

SPANISH CLASSES FOR OUR FOREIGN COMMUNITY

Since the beginning of February, once a week, Miss Bere Rosas gathers our Lakesiders from Russia, Ukraine, Turkey, China, Indonesia, Japan, Korea, the United States, Czech Republic and Libya to give them classes in Spanish, hoping that they can gradually improve their oral production in our language. Students from Kinder 3 to 9th Grade have a weekly session where they are taught grammar and vocabulary in Spanish.
